

West Kildonan By-Laws 1914-1919

By-Law 1 – April 1, 1914 – To appoint Thomas Little Secretary-Treasurer of West Kildonan at a salary of \$1,200 per year

By-Law 2 – April 1, 1914 – To appoint Francis Edward William Eatwell, Engineer of West Kildonan

By-Law 3 – April 1, 1914 – To appoint Thomas Cassidy the Local Improvement Assessor

By-Law 4 – April 1, 1914, To improve Plan 188 by changing the location of street crossings in Plan 188 so street crossing with coincide with streets immediately north and south of Plan 188

By-Law 5 – April 1, 1914 – To provide for the opening of McGregor Street across Kildonan Parish Lots 5 and 6

By-Law 6 – April 6, 1914 – To authorize Reeve Edmund Partridge and Secretary-Treasurer Thomas Little to transact general banking business at the Imperial Bank of Canada in the City of Winnipeg

By-Law 7 – April 6, 1914 – To borrow \$50,000 from the Imperial Bank of Canada to meet current expenditures

By-Law 8 – April 6, 1914 – To authorize the Rural Municipality of West Kildonan to take over the account of the former Municipality of Kildonan at the Imperial Bank of Canada under the authority of Order in Council 22398 establishing elections in West Kildonan and East Kildonan.

By-Law 9 – April 15, 1914 – To transfer all portions of Plan 188 to the Register-General that were taken to improve Plan 188

By-Law 10 – April 24, 1914 – To close the western portion of the lane in Kildonan Parish Lots 7, 8 and 9 Plan 250 parallel to the eastern boundary of McPhillips Street

By-Law 11 – April 24, 1914 – To divide West Kildonan into four wards

Ward One – The inner two miles of the Parish of Kildonan from the northern boundary of the City of Winnipeg on the east side of Main Street to the centre of the lane north of Semple Avenue. On the west side of Main Street to the southern limits of Kildonan Avenue

Ward Two – The inner two miles of the Parish of Kildonan. On the east side of Main Street from the centre of the lane north of Semple Avenue to the lane north of Langford Avenue. On the west side of Main Street from the south limit of Kildonan Avenue to the lane north of Langford Avenue

Ward Three – The inner two miles of the Parish of Kildonan from the lane north of Langford Avenue to the West St Paul Boundary

Ward Four – All of the outer two miles of the Parish of Kildonan

By-Law 12 – April 24, 1914 – To ratify an agreement with the City of Winnipeg regarding the Jefferson Avenue Sewer

By-Law 13 – May 20, 1914 – To provide for the removal of manure from stables and to provide for the proper receptacles for depositing same

By-Law 14 – May 20, 1914 – To regulate the owners and keepers of restaurants and other places of refreshments for an annual licence fee of \$10

By-Law 15 – June 3, 1914 - To create a debt of \$13,500 by the issue and sale of debentures for the purpose of providing a municipal fire hall. The by-law is approved by the electors on May 29, 1914 with the vote taking place at Centennial School.

By-Law 16 – To provide for the construction of a sidewalk on the east side of Main Street from the southern boundary to Kildonan Parish Lot 18 and to create a debt of \$6,500 to build the sidewalk. Not passed.

By-Law 17 – May 20, 1914 – To licence and regulate and govern hawkers and peddlers with an annual fee of \$20 for a man and his horse and \$10 for a man on foot

By-Law 18 – May 20, 1914 – To change the name of certain streets and avenues

By-Law 20 – June 3, 1914 – To build a plank sidewalk on the north side of Templeton from Main to Aikins at a cost of \$235.06

By-Law 21 – June 3, 1914 – To build a plank sidewalk on the south side of Jefferson Avenue from Prince Street to McPhillips Street at a cost of \$428.80

By-Law 22 – June 3, 1914 – To build a plank sidewalk on the south side of Commonwealth Avenue from Main to Lot 16 Block 2 Plan 1224 at a cost of \$290

By-Law 23 – June 3, 1914 – To build a plank sidewalk on the south side of Forest Avenue from Main to Scotia at a cost of \$497.65

By-Law 36 – June 3, 1914 – To build a plank sidewalk on the north side of Leila from Main to Scotia at a cost of \$1,667

By-Law 37 – May 28, 1914 – To construct a concrete sidewalk on the east side of Main Street from the southern boundary to Kildonan Parish Lot 18 and to create a debt of \$8,000 by the issue and sales of debentures

By-Law 38 – June 3, 1914 – To provide for the construction of a sewer on the east side of Aikins, along Jefferson to Main, along Main to Randolph and along Randolph to the Red River in conjunction with the City of Winnipeg and to create a debt of \$35,000 for paying a portion of the cost of the sewer.

By-Law 39 – June 3, 1914 – To provide for the widening and improving of Forest Avenue to Scotia and to create a debt of \$4,000

By-Law 40 – June 3, 1914 – To create a debt of \$4,000 to widen and improve Burrin from Main to McPhillips

By-Law 41 – June 3, 1914 – To provide for the licencing of certain occupations

Abattoirs or Slaughterhouses - \$10 per year

Book Agents - \$10 per year

Advertising Wagons - \$10 per year

Billiard or Pool Tables – flat fee of \$30 per year for first table, \$15 for each additional table

Bowling Alleys - \$15 for first alley and \$10 per additional alley

Canvassers - \$10 per year

Hawkers and Peddlers - \$20 per year

Itinerant Photographer - \$10 per year

Tobacco Sellers - \$15 per year

For violations of the by-law, penalties of up to \$50 plus costs and or hard labour in jail for up to 21 days

By-Law 42 – June 3, 1914 – To consolidate By-Laws 19-36 in one issue of debentures equalling \$12,115.93

By-Law 42A – June 3, 1914 – To create four local improvement districts with the same boundaries as the ward boundaries

By-Laws 43 to 70 are local improvement by-laws, no further information given

By-Law 71 – July 15, 1914 – To amend By-Law 70 and to provide for the issue of \$60,000 in debentures to provide for the draining and paving of Main Street from the southern boundary to the northern limits of Kildonan Parish Lot 23.

By-Law 72 – July 15, 1914 - To create a debt of \$8,000 by the issue and sale of debentures to open and improve Scotia Street from Kildonan Parish Lot 6 to Kildonan Parish Lot 16

By-Law 73 – July 23, 1914 – To borrow \$25,000 from the Imperial Bank of Canada to meet current expenditures

By-Laws 74 to 81 is local improvement by-laws, no further information given

By-Law 82 – September 2, 1914 – To amend By-Law 14 by inserting after the word “sold” in the third line and adding “and consumed upon the premises”

By-Law 83 – September 2, 1914 - To amend By-Law 18 by changing in clause 13 Laird be changed to Armstrong

By-Law 84 – August 6, 1914 – To licence and regulate all teams within West Kildonan by paying an annual licence fee of \$5

By-Law 85 – September 9, 1914 – To amend By-Law 318 of the Rural Municipality and Kildonan and to adopt it as a by-law of West Kildonan known as the “Herd By-Law”

By-Law 86 – September 9, 1914 – To amend By-Law 314 of the Rural Municipality of Kildonan relating to the restraining and running at large of dogs and adopting by-law of West Kildonan. The licence fee for dog kennels is \$10 per year and dog found running at large shall be kept for 72 hours by the Poundkeeper and then sold or destroyed

By-Law 87 – September 9, 1914 – To amend and adopt By-Law 317 of the Rural Municipality of Kildonan as a by-law of West Kildonan. To forbid the crossing of cattle over any driveway, boulevard or grass plot in the built up area and to forbid any obstructions over the sidewalks and roadways of West Kildonan.

By-Law 88 – September 9, 1914 – To amend and adopt By-Law 364 of the Rural Municipality of Kildonan and adopt it as a by-law of West Kildonan

By-Law 89 – September 12, 1914 – To rescind an agreement with the Bank of Nova Scotia to sell \$225,000 worth of bonds to the bank

By-Law 90 – September 16, 1914 – To deposit \$77,000 and an advance of \$90,000 from the Bank of Nova Scotia to an account at the Bank of Nova Scotia in Winnipeg

By-Law 91 – September 16, 1914 – To purchase Lots 11 and 12 in Block 34 of Kildonan Parish Lot 9 for \$2,475 for the erection of a fire hall

By-Law 92 – September 16, 1914 – To levy a rate upon all property in West Kildonan to raise funds and approve estimates for West Kildonan

Municipal Commissioner’s Levy - \$3,603.39

West Kildonan School District Levy Special Rate - \$19,737.45

West Kildonan School District Levy General School Purposes - \$3,120

By-Law 93 – October 7, 1914 – To provide for penalties for violation of by-laws passed by the municipality where no specific penalty is provided for. The fines for each offence are not to be less than \$1.00 or more than \$50.00.

By-Law 94 – October 17, 1914 – To borrow \$15,000 from the Imperial Bank of Canada to meet current expenditures

By-Law 95 – October 21, 1914 – To charge all expenses for public health including the removal of night soil, garbage, burying of animals, salaries of Health Officers to the municipality as a whole.

By-Law 96 – November 17, 1914 – To close a portion of Scotia Street and open a portion of Scotia Street and to open, extend and improve a portion of Belmont Avenue

By-Law 97 – November 26, 1914 – To borrow \$90,000 from the Bank of Nova Scotia and deposit \$148,886.70 in debentures in the bank as security for the loan

By-Law 98 – December 8, 1914 – To determine the remuneration to be paid to the Reeve and each member of Council for 1914

By-Law 99 – November 1, 1915 – To appoint a Chimney Inspector for West Kildonan and appoint Chimney Sweeps. Fees to be charged by Chimney Sweeps

For sweeping and cleaning each chimney or flue in a one-storey building – 20 cents

For each additional storey, each chimney or flue – 10 cents

For sweeping or cleaning furnace and flue where the pipes connect in the basement – 30 cents

For sweeping or cleaning furnace and flue where pipe connection is above the basement – 25 cents

For sweeping and cleaning each range or stove and flues – 25 cents

By-Law 102 – February 20, 1915 – To consolidate into one issue, Local Improvement By-Laws 75-80 into one debenture issue of \$18,135

By-Law 75 – Sewer on Norman Street from Perth Avenue to Tait Avenue - \$3,900

By-Law 76 – Sewer on Leila Avenue from Main Street to the Red River - \$8,000

By-Law 77 – Sewer on Burrin Avenue from Main Street to Aikins Street - \$1,550

By-Law 78 – Sewer on Semple Avenue from Aikins Street to a point 660 west of Aikins Street - \$860

By-Law 79 – Sewer on Scotia Street from Perth Avenue to Randolph Avenue - \$2,200

By-Law 80 – Sewer on Rupertsland Boulevard from 100 feet east of Main Street to Norman Street and Norman Street from Rupertsland Boulevard to Smithfield Avenue - \$1,625

By-Law 103 – March 19, 1915 – To appoint William Ballard as Acting Secretary-Treasurer at \$85 per month

By-Law 104 – April 6, 1915 – To provide for the closing for that part of Forest Avenue provided for by By-Law 393 of the Municipality of Kildonan

By-Law 105 – April 20, 1915 – To appoint William Ballard as Secretary-Treasurer at \$125 per month

By-Law 106 – May 18, 1915 – To provide for the impounding of animals running at large, the duties of the Poundkeeper and penalties for animals running at large and fees to be charged by Poundkeeper for impounding animals

All bulls, stallions, boars, cattle, horses, mules, sheep, goats, pigs, turkeys, geese or poultry are prohibited from running at large with the fine being \$20 per animal

For impounding bulls, stallions, boars and rams - \$2.00 per animal

For impounding cattle, horses and mules - \$1.00 per animal

For impounding sheep, goats and swine – 50 cents per animal

For impounding turkeys, geese and other poultry – 25 cents per animal

Fees to be charged for every day animal is impounded

Bulls, stallions, boars, rams, horses, mules and cattle – 50 cents

Goats and swine – 25 cents

Turkeys, geese and poultry – 5 cents

By-Law 107 – May 18, 1915 – To restrain, regulate the running at large of dogs and fees for dog licences

Male Dogs - \$1.00 per year

Bitches (Female Dogs) - \$3.00 per year

By-Law 108 – May 18, 1915 – To regulate the owners and keepers of restaurants and to charge a licence fee of \$10 per year for each restaurant or other place of refreshments

By-Law 109 – May 18, 1915 - To prohibit barbed wire along adjoining any public highway in West Kildonan with the fine set for any breach of the by-law set at not less than \$5.00 or more than \$10.00

By-Law 110 – May 18, 1915 – To provide for the use of fenders by streetcars propelled by electricity or other motive power with the penalty for each infraction, not less than \$10.00 and costs and not more than \$50.00 and costs.

By-Law 111 – May 18, 1915 – To prohibit dance halls in West Kildonan with a maximum fine not to exceed \$50 plus costs

By-Law 112 – May 18, 1915 – To restrict the erection of poles and wires in West Kildonan unless approved by the Municipal Engineer with a maximum fine of \$50 plus costs

By-Law 113 – May 18, 1915 – To licence, regulate and govern the work of teams within the municipality. No team shall do work in West Kildonan without first obtaining a licence and paying a licence fee of \$5 per year.

By-Law 114 – April 28, 1915 – To expend the sum of \$1,000 in the planting and preserving of shade or ornamental trees upon the highways and roads of the municipality. Grants may be expended to any person or association for the same purpose or for trees already planted.

By-Laws 115 to 132 are local improvement by-laws.

By-Law 133 is a consolidation of by-laws 115 to 132

By-Law 134 – September 21, 1915 – To regulate and set requirements for plumbing and drainage work

By-Law 135 – October 5, 1915 – To provide for a supply of water in portions of the municipality and to levy the sums required to sink wells

By-Law 138 – July 20, 1915 – To divide West Kildonan into wards

By-Law 139 – August 17, 1915 – To regulate vehicles and vehicular traffic. Speed limit for motor vehicles 15 mph

By-Law 140 – August 17, 1915 – To regulate Public Morals

1. No person may go door to door or any public street begging for money. No malformed, deformed or diseased person shall expose himself in any public place or street to incite sympathy to induce help.
2. Any person found drunk or disorderly on any public street or public place, or in any saloon, hotel or other house of public entertainment and all vagrants shall be subject to the penalties of this by-law
3. No person shall make use of any profane, swearing, obscene, blasphemous or grossly insulting language or be guilty of any other immorality or indecency in any street or public place
4. No person shall use any means of gambling in any of the streets in the municipality
5. No person shall keep or allow any form of gambling in any room, house or building
6. No person shall keep or maintain or be an inmate of any disorderly house or house of ill-fame
7. No person shall indecently expose any part of his or her person in any street or public place
8. No person shall post up or put up any indecent placard, writing, picture or write any indecent or immoral words or make any indecent pictures or drawings on any public or private property
9. No person shall publish, expose or circulate offer for sale or distribute any obscene, libellous or scandalous book, magazine publication, circular, picture or drawing of any immoral or scandalous nature.
10. No person or persons shall give or exhibit any immoral or lewd play, public entertainment, variety show or other representation of an immoral or blasphemous or indecent nature
11. No person in any public entertainment in any place or any building shall make any indecent exposure of the body
12. No person shall bathe or swim along or near the bank of the Red River in sight of any street, lane or any building between 6 in the morning and nine in the evening

Any violation of this by-law is subject to a fine of not more than \$50 and costs or 21 days of hard labour in a jail

By-Law 141 – August 17, 1915 – To regulate, the construction, alteration, repair, removal and inspection of buildings in West Kildonan to prevent accident by fire.
