War and Peace Time Homes in East Kildonan 1948 - 1950

At the end of World War Two there was a severe housing shortage through out Canada caused by the lack of homes built during the Great Depression and the war years. The Government of Canada initiated a housing project through the Central Mortgage & Housing Corporation. These homes were built to house veterans and their families. The homes were first rented and then offered for sale to the renting family. The first homes were built in the Greater Winnipeg area in 1945 in a standardized floor plan with an upside down v shape roof, without basements these were called wartime houses. Beginning in 1946 new homes was built with basements these are referred to as peacetime homes. These standardized houses continue to be built until 1950.

There were 70 of these peacetime built in East Kildonan from 1948 to 1950. The largest number of homes built in East Kildonan consisted of 5 rooms but there were many 4 room homes and even one 6 room and one 7 room home.
