Of the 800 residential lots in the original 346-acre tract 470 have been sold and applications have been received by the company for nearly all the other lots,

Provision for industrial development has been allowed for in both areas with a total of about 400 acres being set aside for this purpose under the agreement with the municipality.

THREE-YEAR PERIOD

Original time-table for the 800home area called for installation services over a three-year period. In a matter of months the more than \$500,000 job of extending sewer and wafer facilities throughout the area has been largely completed.

Building of the first 800 homes was to have been spread over a 10-year period. Now half of these houses are under construction
