

LAWN BOWLERS MARK OPENING NEW CLUB-HOUSE

New Club-House of East Kildonan Lawn Bowling Club Formally Opened Saturday — Many Visitors Attracted to Greens on Auspicious Occasion

The greens of the East Kildonan lawn bowling club, ideally situated on the river side of the Henderson Highway at Helmsdale avenue, accommodated a large number of residents Saturday afternoon, more than one of whom enjoyed their first game in pursuit of the "jack." Many favorable comments were heard upon the happy choice of a location and the condition of the greens generally. Indeed the whole venture, providing as it does for the entire community a further avenue of social intercourse and healthful recreation, reflects creditably upon those who promoted it.

The greens will accommodate 64 players, and the lighting arrangement over each is of the most improved type, more than one of the participants Saturday afternoon expressing the opinion the green was one of the best lighted in the neighborhood.

The new club-house, measuring 16-ft.x32-ft., and situated on the north side of the green, was open for inspection. The ladies' quarters are on the main floor, with kitchen to the rear, while the men repair to the full basement to reach their apportioned quarters. In the course of the afternoon refreshments were served by the ladies.
